I grew up in a hardworking, faithful and faith filled family. Each week during worship, I watched my parents put their church envelope in the offering plate as it went by and I would add the coins they had given me. We never talked about what was in their envelope, but they were modeling for me and my siblings what it looked like to live generously. Without their speaking a word, I learned to give each week.

While my parents didn’t talk about what to give; through their example, scripture, and the church I learned that living faithfully meant living generously.

When I was in seminary, commuting each week between Appleton and Dubuque, there was a church family that regularly sent me \$100 gas cards. Having moved from a two income family to one and adding the financial burden of seminary, their gift was huge for us. Whenever I thanked them for their generosity, they would respond by telling me how important supporting God’s work through supporting my seminary journey was to them. They too taught me that living faithfully meant living generously.

Have you ever stopped to think about who have been role models to you for living generously? Offer a prayer of thanksgiving for them!

October kicks off our Stewardship education and intent program at St. John. The Stewardship team and I are excited at the opportunity this presents for us to learn and grow as a congregation in generosity and what this growth will mean for the ministry of St. John.

As my family thinks about our giving for next year, we will be challenging ourselves to grow in generosity and to talk about what living generously means with our kids, so that they too might learn and grow.

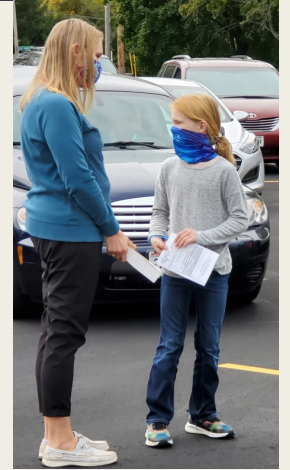
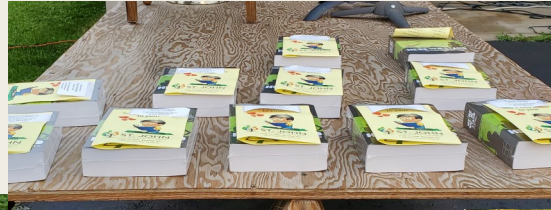

~Stained Glass at St. John~

The new exterior sanctuary windows are all in and they look wonderful! But what about the stained glass? Glad you asked! Putting stained glass in the entire sanctuary will likely be a multi-year project, but we have begun the process. We have been working with the Glass Haus on a design and are excited to share with you this artist rendering of the choir area. Each window in this area contains a symbol that is central to our Lutheran faith; Holy Communion, The Trinity and Baptism. The glass that will be used will compliment the glass in the pieces from the original church that now hang in the back of the sanctuary. We are excited to share that the choir area is projected to be completed mid - December!



How will it be paid for? Again, glad you asked! This area will cost just under \$11,000. In August the Council voted to direct the remaining funds from the Open Arms Campaign as well as the remaining funds in the 150th Anniversary account towards the stained glass. This leaves just over \$6000 needed to complete this section of stained glass. That amount will come from our Capital Improvements Fund.

At the annual meeting in January we will be sharing artist renderings for the other 4 windows and the altar area. Financing for these projects will also be discussed at that time. Gifts to the stained glass fund are now being accepted. You can send a check noting "Stained Glass" on the memo line. You can also donate through the website by checking the Stained Glass Fund designation in on-line giving.

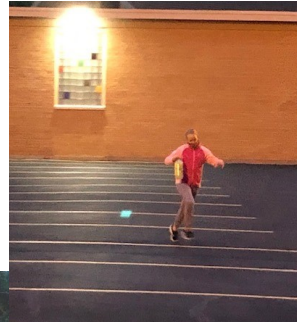
CAMPFIRE FUN!!

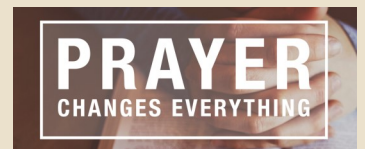

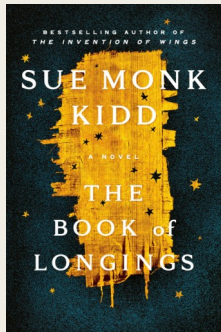
