



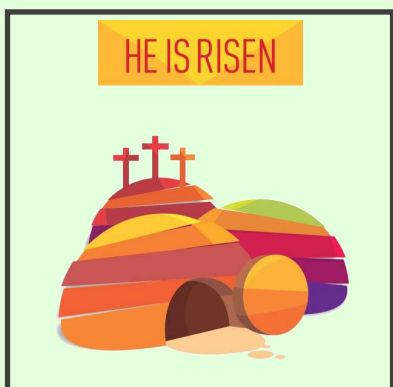

To Members of St John,
 As you know, Pastor Cindy has made the decision to retire on August 17, 2025. This raises questions about what happens next. First, we will continue all normal church services, programs, and events. I am working with Pastor Asher O’Callaghan, Associate to the Bishop, Director for Transitions, who uses a carefully designed process to assist us in this time of transition, which is based on the most up-to-date research and techniques available. I want to share with you an outline of this process and share what this means for our life together.

<p style="text-align: center;">Phase One After a Pastor Resigns</p> <p>We are in this phase right now. We are planning how to best say goodbye and celebrate our time and ministry together with Pastor Cindy. We will keep you posted as plans unfold. At the same time, we are in contact with Pastor Asher to identify the most appropriate choice of a specially trained Intentional Interim Pastor to guide us through this transition.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Phase Two Self-Study and Visioning Process</p> <p>In order to select our next pastor, we will work with the Interim to conduct a study of our congregation and our situation, to develop a Vision of the future mission to which God is calling this congregation, and to discern the type of pastor and the pastoral characteristics needed to lead the congregation to fulfill that Vision. Phase Two concludes with the preparation of a Ministry Site Profile, to be submitted to and approved by the Synod Office.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Phase Three The Call Process</p> <p>After Phase Two is completed, the Congregation Council will appoint a Call Committee who will interview pastoral candidates and recommend a candidate to the Congregation Council. Finally, a new pastor will be called to serve our congregation through a vote of the congregation at a special meeting.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Phase Four Implementation</p> <p>This is when we welcome our new pastor and work toward the Vision of future ministry that we developed during this period of transition.</p> <p>How long will this take?</p>

How long will this take? That is impossible to predict because there are so many factors at play and the Holy Spirit will be a part of the entire process. However, as soon as possible, the Council will agree on an Interim. This means that from an early stage we will have a pastor. Generally, Phase Two takes about eight months, and the entire process may take 12 to 18 months to do properly.

Pastor Asher will be presiding at the 9am service on June 15, while Pastor Cindy is on vacation, and will also hold a question/answer period afterwards. He invites you to bring any questions you may have about the transition process and how this whole thing works.

I ask the congregation members to keep the Council and the Congregation in your prayers as we embark on this journey to search for our next pastor. We, as a council, are willing to answer any questions you have.

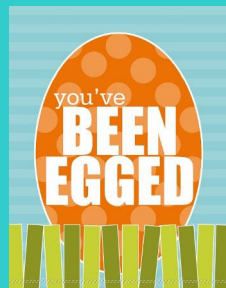

The Women of the Church and the Christ Care group packed and delivered 14 Valentine bags to home bound members of St. John.

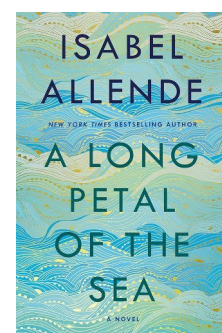
This is an annual project to brighten their day and to let them know that others think about them and care.



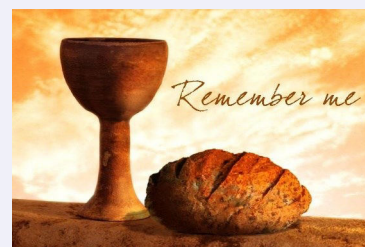

John 12:1-8

Judas willfully misinterprets as waste Mary's extravagant act of anointing Jesus' feet with costly perfume. Jesus recognizes that her lavish gift is both an expression of love and an anticipation of his burial.

Creator God, you prepare a new way in the wilderness, and your grace waters our desert. Open our hearts to be transformed by the new thing you are doing, that our lives may proclaim the extravagance of your love given to all through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. †APRIL 13TH PALM SUNDAY

Luke 22:14-23:56

Through the teachings and events of the passion story we see and hear the great contradictions that characterize the coming of God's reign. The leader serves the followers, proud Peter is revealed in his cowardice, and Jesus—the innocent bringer of life—is arrested, beaten, executed, and buried.

†APRIL 20TH - EASTER DAY

Luke 24:1-12

Evidently expecting to find Jesus' corpse, some of the women among his followers go to the tomb with embalming spices. After a perplexing encounter with the empty tomb and angelic visitors, the women become the first to proclaim the amazing news of resurrection.

Prayer of the Day

O God, you gave your only Son to suffer death on the cross for our redemption, and by his glorious resurrection you delivered us from the power of death. Make us die every day to sin, that we may live with him forever in the joy of the resurrection, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

†APRIL 27TH - SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

John 20:19-31

The unprecedented events of the day of resurrection continue as the risen Jesus appears to his fearful disciples. A week later, after Thomas worships Jesus, Jesus pronounces that the blessings of the resurrection are also for those who "have not seen and yet believe."

Prayer of the Day

O God of life, you reach out to us amid our fears with the wounded hands of your risen Son. By your Spirit's breath revive our faith in your mercy, and strengthen us to be the body of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. 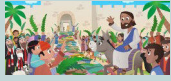
