As April begins, I am wondering if we will see April flowers, or one more snow storm. Thanks to all who helped make our Lenten midweek suppers so delicious and such fun, and to those who led music for Holden Prayer. Also, thanks to the choir for special music Palms Sunday and Easter, to the “Easter Egg Team”; and to Palm Sunday Pancake Cooks.” St. John has some great cooks.

We begin this month with our Holy Week Journey. Palm Sunday praise yields to Maundy Thursday reflections April 2<sup>nd</sup>. We will share dinner together at 6:00 pm, and share Holy Communion. The Passover Meal of old celebrated God’s battle and victory over the gods of Egypt, proving himself superior even over the god of death. What Yahweh won was freedom for his people and the ability to become a new nation. As we listen to Jesus change words about the Passover lamb to words about his own body being given for us, as he holds the wine and speaks of his own blood given for us, we realize that Jesus was headed into a battle with the god of death, to prove that he, as the God of life, was more powerful than death itself. In that battle he would win for us freedom so death could not / would not have the last word. Jesus would claim us, and we would be led by the God of Life.

One of the “Sermon Notes” students asked, “Why did Jesus have to die?” The answer lies in the battle with the power of death itself to win our freedom. To engage in that battle and score a “forever win”, Jesus had to die, battle, and rise. The second part of the answer is that God longs for us to know how much we are loved, to trust God’s love, and embrace a relationship with God based on that love. The Old Testament is about the inability of people to understand, embrace, and live in a love and grace-based relationship with God. Many, if not most people have at some time wondered if someone loves them. How can we prove love? How can God prove love—love no matter what? The only way is to let us hurt, betray, deny, and vent our anger on God and in the midst of our brokenness hear God speak love and forgiveness for us. The only way is for us to use our energy to totally destroy the relationship, and have God still love us. Thus, the cross on Good Friday is for us, for you and for me.

The story goes on, however, to Easter and resurrection. Jesus proves his power over death, and in the resurrection stories that follow proves that even though we are so unworthy, Jesus loves us, seeks us out, forgives us, and commissions us to live! That may be the hardest message to fully understand and embrace—that God loves us no matter what; that nothing can separate us from the love of God. Inadequate as our abilities, faith, and faithfulness are, Jesus loves us and wants us to carry His name and power into the world.

So, join us in April as we hear this good news. Join us as we strive to live this good news. Join us as we seek to be the hands, feet, arms of love, and the word of grace and hope to a world in need. When in the communion meal Jesus passes the cup and says, “Drink you all of this,” I believe he held what was called the Elijah cup—the cup that looks to see if Elijah has come back. When Jesus gives it to us to drink, when he says, “This is my blood, this is my life-force, drink of it,” he is saying that his life force in us empowers and sends us out to be the living message that God is with us. How exciting! How important to walk together as we live out our call.

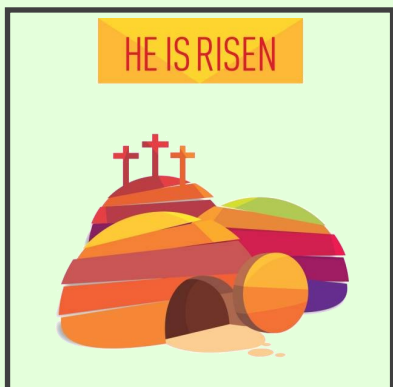
PS. A note to confirmation Sermon Note Writers:

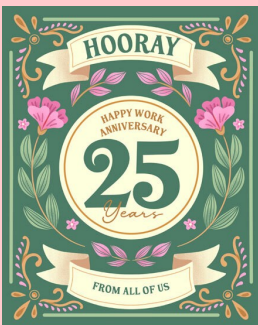
## CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE
