




Hat Day!



Call to Order: Travis called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm.

Scripture study, discussion, and prayer: Scripture selection from John 17:1-11 read by Katie. Following discussion, Travis led the prayer of the day.

Approval of Agenda: Travis asked for a motion to approve tonight's Agenda or for any changes. Greenwood Cemetery was added to New Business. The motion was made by Ryan; second by Bill. Motion carried.

Approval of Consent Agenda:

DPCO Donation. There was discussion about the request from DPCO to Celebration and Outreach for funds to be used for an expansion for the food pantry and a truck for picking up donations. First Congregational UCC will match donations. Celebration and Outreach will apply to the Stewardship Committee for a Ministry Innovation Grant.

GREAT Room flooring. Property and Grounds got a quote for \$14,000 for flooring for the kitchen, storage room, pantry, GREAT Room, Luther Room and hallway. The discussion was tabled pending further details.

After this discussion, Travis asked for a motion to approve tonight's Consent Agenda. The motion was made by Kim; second by Katie. Motion carried.

Discussion Agenda

New Business

Masking during Holy Communion. The Executive Committee met in early May and decided that, due to current information from the Health Department, communion servers would not need to mask. That was a temporary provision that expired with this meeting. After discussion, Bill motioned that going forward, communion servers no longer be required to mask. A vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Council Volunteer to greet visiting pastor on Sunday, June 25th. Ryan will do this.

Greenwood Cemetery. A member shared with Pastor Cindy that the roads at Greenwood Cemetery have become so damaged that people are no longer allowed to enter the cemetery and visit graves. There are many former members who are buried there, and the member asked if St. John would be able to donate funds to repair the road. After discussion, it was decided not to set a precedent for donating to projects where there is no direct connection to St. John's ministry.

Old Business

Electronic Account Security Procedures. Travis will create a written policy that describes how user names and passwords are currently handled for the church's electronic accounts. We will then discuss if changes need to be made.

Vision for Ministry: Living our faith. Enriching lives. Pillars of focus: Extraordinary Hospitality and Celebration, Enthusiastic Worship, Engaging Faith Formation, Enriching Mission and Service. Celebration

and Outreach has made a SMART goal for the church campout. Travis shared a SMART goal he will be proposing to the Trust Fund. Other committees will be making SMART goals at their future committee meetings.

Call to Order: Travis called the meeting to order at 7:06 pm.

Scripture study, discussion, and prayer: Scripture selection from Matthew 10:24-39 read by Travis. Following discussion, Mike led the prayer of the day.

Approval of Agenda: Travis asked for a motion to approve tonight's Agenda or for any changes. The motion was made by Bill; second by Dick. Motion carried.

5. Approval of Consent Agenda:

a. **Emergency shelter.** Susan shared that the Wisconsin Council of Churches is very early in the process of organizing churches who would be willing to serve as a Shelter in Place location. These would be short-term stays that are due to an emergency. Examples would be people displaced by a fire or weather, or a temporary stay when local homeless shelters are filled. Telling the WCC we are interested is not a commitment from St. John, but rather a way of exploring the idea. Council had several questions/concerns about logistics but agreed that it is consistent with our vision. Susan will let the WCC know that we are interested in learning more.

a. **Furnace replacements.** Dick reported that the last two furnaces being replaced on a rotating basis will be done at a cost of \$14,000.

b. **GREAT Room flooring.** Dick reported that the GREAT room flooring will be replaced, 4 ½ ⁻⁻ mop board installed, as well as the flooring on both levels by the elevators. The initial estimate is in the range of \$15,000. Council suggested asking Trina Schepp for her opinion on the flooring options.

Sanctuary/Narthex basement furnace. While doing their biannual inspection/filter replacement, Foreman Heating recommended replacing the sanctuary/narthex basement furnace be replaced in the next few years as the efficiency of the current furnace is deteriorating. Foreman Heating is preparing a quote for updating or replacing, and Council will discuss again when that quote is submitted.

Following this discussion, Travis asked for a motion to approve tonight's Consent Agenda. The motion was made by Susan; second by Bill. Motion carried.

Discussion Agenda

New Business

Council person to greet Rev. Lin Reichstadter on Sunday July 23rd. Mike will do this.

Finance recommendations for CDs. Mike presented options for investing our excess funds. Right now we have \$201,367 in our savings account which is only earning a half percent of interest. We also have a \$30,000 CD that matures in September. Travis asked for a motion stating that council authorizes the finance committee to spend up to \$25,000 for a 1-year CD from the ELCA Mission Investment Fund. The ELCA uses this money for building and improving ELCA churches and ministries nation-wide. Council also authorizes the finance committee to buy a \$75,000 21-month CD from Community First Credit Union. The motion was made by Dick; second by Lin. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business

Electronic Account Security Procedures. Travis will update next month.

Land Use – Long Range Planning. Travis passed out a map of St. John's property. There is a parcel of land in the rear of the property that has been used by Syble Hopp in the past, but they no longer do. Council will begin thinking about ways to use that land to fulfill our vision.


