DWELLING IN SCRIPTURE CONTINUED

DECEMBER 24TH 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Luke 1:26-38

In this annunciation, Luke makes clear that God comes with good news for ordinary people from little known places. This king will not be born to royalty in a palace, but to common folk in a stall. Here Luke highlights the role of the Spirit, a special emphasis in this gospel.

Prayer of the Day

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. With your abundant grace and might, free us from the sin that would obstruct your mercy, that willingly we may bear your redeeming love to all the world, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

DECEMBER 31ST 1ST SUNDAY OF CHRISTMAS

Luke 2:22-40

Luke's narrative continues with stories that emphasize Jesus' connection to Judaism. His family is devout in its observance of the law, and Jesus himself is recognized as one who will bring glory to Israel.

Prayer of the Day

Almighty God, you wonderfully created the dignity of human nature and yet more wonderfully restored it. In your mercy, let us share the divine life of the one who came to share our humanity, Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Pray for the church, the world, your prayer list, the people in the church directory and anything else that the Holy Spirit places on your heart.



<u>After 8:00am service</u> - Remove empty wine/juice trays from altar. Consolidate any partial trays and replenish altar with 3 full trays of wine/juice. Refill wafers as needed.

Retrieve baskets of empty glasses. Rinse and recycle glasses. Put one empty basket back by piano and the other empty basket back on the altar. If time allows– fill empty trays with glasses. (Do not fill with wine/juice.)

After 10:00am service or when there is only 1

service - Remove empty wine/juice trays from altar. Consolidate any partial trays, cover top tray with plastic and refrigerate. Wipe out any used trays. If time allows refill empty trays with glasses. (Do not fill with wine/juice.)

Retrieve baskets of empty glasses. Rinse and recycle glasses. Put one empty basket back by piano and the other empty basket back on the altar.

Leave silver base, cover, chalice and altar clothes on the altar.





Recently on a bright sunny morning our delivery team arrived at our first stop of the day. It was an older apartment building that was recently renovated with new locks, paint, and flooring. Mom met us at the door and to our surprise she ushered us into a downstairs apartment. You see we always seem to deliver to the second floor so it's starting off to be a good day. As we entered the apartment the lights were off and the living room curtains drawn closed making it hard to see as she led us towards the bedroom. Suddenly out of the corner of my eye something on the floor moved! Was it a cat or dog my mind thought as I struggled to make out the image in the darkness. Nevertheless Mom continued on and we entered the bedroom where she explained where we would be setting up the bunk bed and the single bed for her three boys. We turned around ready to retrieve our tools and supplies from the trailer when the lights were turned on in the hallway. To my surprise I'm now looking at the floor where something had just moved again. But this time it wasn't the pet my eyes couldn't make out earlier. It was three kids all under the age of ten, snuggled together in a nest of blankets and clothes. They had spent the night on the cold hard laminate floor struggling to find a comfortable place to sleep. Our team made quick work of assembling the beds and we were off to the next delivery but not without a reminder of our mission.


