

1. Attendance:

- 2. **Call to Order:** Sean called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.
- 3. **Scripture study, discussion, and prayer:** Scripture selection from John 18:33-37 read by Lin. Following discussion, Susan led the prayer of the day.
- 4. **Approval of Agenda:** Sean asked for a motion to approve tonight's Agenda or for any changes. Reconciling in Christ and Ministry Innovations were added to New Business. The motion was made by Kim; second by Lin. Motion carried.
- 5. **Approval of Consent Agenda:** Sean asked for a motion to approve tonight's Consent Agenda or for any changes. The motion was made by Katie; second by Susan. Motion carried.

Discussion Agenda

New Business

- **6. Pastor's IRS Housing Allowance.** Lin moved that the Reverend Cindy Warmbier-Meyer receive a total housing allowance of \$24,000.00 for 2025, the housing allowance to be designated in the official records. Second by Kim. Motion carried.
- 7. **Nominating Committee Update.** Everything is filled except for two council positions. One is close to being filled and the other is in progress.
- 8. **Ministry Innovations.** We have a budgeted amount of \$5,000 in Stewardship under the heading of Ministry Innovations. This year there have been no requests for this money. Lin moved that we donate \$3000 to Crossways Camps, \$3000 to Sleep in Heavenly Peace for a build in 2025, and \$1000 to the Ecumenical Partnership for Housing. Second by Kim. Motion carried.
- 9. **Reconciling in Christ.** To become a partner with Reconciling in Christ, St. John would commit to being a congregation that is welcoming to LGBTQIA+ people and people of color. Becoming a RIC partner involves a series of trainings and creating a team to work through the process.

Old Business

- 10. **Budget 2025.** Mike gave an overview of the 2025 budget. Susan moved to accept the budget. Second by Katie. Motion carried.
- 11. **Land Use Update– Long Range Planning.** Via email, Ryan said it was suggested that we consider putting the columbarium inside the building. Concerns were raised about the accessibility of an indoor columbarium.
