THE FAITHFUL JOURNEY CONTINUES: WHAT'S NEXT?

Congratulations, St. John Lutheran Church! You are about to turn a major corner in the process of calling a new pastor. Thank you for your thoughtful responses on the survey; you gave the MSP (Mission Site Profile) team clear direction in what to include on the document that prospective pastors will peruse in determining if St. John would be a good fit for them. Their work is done and we owe them a great deal of thanks for shining a positive yet honest light on the mission of St. John.

With that accomplished, I'd like to give you an idea about how the process works going forward.

First, a big thank you to the people who stepped forward to become the call committee. The initial task of the call committee is to formulate a set of interview questions that will again help determine a candidate's potential for success at St. John's. While some questions will be pretty basic, others are structured to discern how a candidate might function in the framework for ministry of this congregation and community.

Following this, the team then has the responsibility to filter through candidates' paperwork (called the Rostered Leader Profile) in making certain that they are a potential fit for leadership here. All will have solid qualifications; it's their experience and vision for mission that will make them more apt to be successful in this setting. Using the MSP as a guide for reflection, the call committee will decide who to call for a first interview and who to release from the process.

First interviews are always done online, leveling the playing field for candidates both near and far. This also saves the congregation the expense of travel, housing, and meals for each prospective candidate that would be incurred with an in-person interview. When this round of interviews is completed, the team then considers which (if any) of the candidates to bring here for a second interview. Of course, not only is the call committee learning more about the candidates, but the candidates are learning more about us.

When an invited candidate agrees to come to De Pere for a second interview, the committee prepares for their visit by providing lodging at a nearby hotel and arranging airport transportation for the candidate and spouse if necessary. This interview visit also includes a tour of the town, probably including a drive by Lambeau Field, as well as a look around our building. The in-person interview offers a great opportunity for both the call committee and candidate to sense how they all might come together in mission.

When the interviews are complete and a "candidate of choice" has been agreed upon by the call committee, that candidate is presented to the church council for approval. At this point, salary and benefits are mutually agreed upon along with starting dates or any variety of things that need to be in place for the call to begin. After approval, the candidate has the opportunity to indicate their interest to be called here to St. John. With a positive response from the candidate, a congregational meeting is set for the purpose of presenting that candidate and then voting to extend a call. A two-thirds majority of those present is required to extend that call. After the call is extended, the candidate will be given a brief time of reflection to either accept or turn back the call. Upon acceptance, the candidate will usually be in place as your pastor in a matter of a few weeks.

How long might this entire process take? Anywhere from a couple of months to any amount of time beyond that. Know that St. John is a desirable call, which should keep the waiting from being too long. The Holy Spirit ultimately guides the timing, so have patience knowing that God will have the right person in place to lead St. John in God's good time.

The Middle School Youth had a great time snow tubing with the synod on January 17th at Winter Park in Kewaunee.





Baptism


