



In John's gospel, Jesus' ministry begins with the call of disciples, who then bring others to Jesus. Philip's friend Nathanael moves from skepticism to faith when he accepts the invitation to "Come and see."

The Grief Lectionary A Resource for Grieving Christians

Born out of her own deep grief experience, Collette Broady Grund created this study, using Scripture to access and process grief. A Scripture story is paired with one or more stages of grief. Participants are invited to access their grief through an opening

meditation, then read the Scripture story and reflect on questions. The session lasts just over an hour and closes with a blessing, meant to remind participants that God is present and at work in the grieving process.

While this is written as a 6-session study, at this time we will be doing only the first session. This is a small group study. To best facilitate that, total participants are limited to 8.
