#### "Good Shepherd"

This image of Jesus has greeted those entering St. John for years.
The new images by the snack/coffee area seek to move all of us to a more globally inclusive image of God.



#### "The Risen Lord"

Chinese artist He Qi uses geometrical blocks of imagery and bold colors to make us reflect on the painting representing the familiar while at the same time challenging our perception by using attention-grabbing colors and boldly intersecting lines. After studying medieval art in Germany which most often shows biblical scenes with Europeanlooking people in European settings, He Qi was inspired to depict biblical stories against a Chinese background with Chinese characters.



#### "You Are Loved"

The image of Jesus in front of a colorful background, inspired by the traditional rainbow colors represent the LGBTQ community. The addition of the black and brown stripes are meant to represent the black and brown members of the LGBTQ community, and the light blue, light pink, and white colors specifically represent the transgender community. The symbols on the cross behind Jesus stand for "He Who Is." It's common to see the symbols on ancient (and modern) iconography.



## "Jesus of the People"

by Janet McKenzie has been described as a "haunting image of a peasant Jesus-dark, thick-lipped, looking out on us with ineffable dignity, with sadness but with confidence. Over His white robe He draws the darkness of our lack of love, holding it to Himself, prepared to transform all sorrows if we will let him ."

Throughout Matthew's gospel, Jesus and his disciples proclaim the good news that "the kingdom of heaven is near!" Here, Jesus offers several brief parables that explore the implications of this announcement for people's lives. Amen.


