Greetings!

I am Pastor Diane Wheatley and look forward to joining your team at St. John starting March 2nd. I will be walking with you until your new permanent pastor comes. I was born in Portland, Oregon, received a B.A. in English and M Ed from Stanford University, taught English at Monte Vista High in Cupertino, CA, and was a curriculum editor and Education workshop leader for ten years with Gospel Light Publications and their International Center for Learning.

I received my Masters of Divinity from Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, California, and since June 1984 have served ELCA churches in Encinitas (San Diego), CA; campus ministry at Gettysburg College, then Ithaca College and Cornell University; 19 years as Pastor of St. Paul's, Liverpool (Syracuse), NY, followed by 7 years part time in Fulton, NY. Among various adventures in Upstate New York, I also served on their Conflict and Healing Team 15 years, attended four national youth gatherings, and developed and taught boundary workshops for multiple denominations. December 2023 I retired for the second time, but continue to teach one week in July at their Hartwick Lay institute, and write a weekly "Grace Notes" article for the Fulton and Oswego NY newspapers. My daughter and I selected articles, added art and poetry and published them September 2023 as "Feathers of Grace."

I am at heart a California body surfing lover of my daughter Susan and her husband George (Kaukauna), anything water, travel, stories by people, watching sports, varieties of opinions, and good worship. I moved to Kimberly December 21, 2024 to live my last lap near the kids and build memories with them.

So I am in the process of writing a new chapter, and delighted that you will be part of my story and I will be part of yours. My main responsibilities are worship and pastoral care. I will be with you all of March and then two to three Sundays a month after that until the new pastor comes, Wednesdays in Lent, and Holy Week; Confirmation here through May 3rd; and as needed. I will set up office hours once a week—at the moment on Wednesdays. However, I am flexible and my phone is always open to you. You can reach me at 315-243-7121 or pstrwheatley@gmail.com.






