What is keeping you "centered" or "sane" right now?

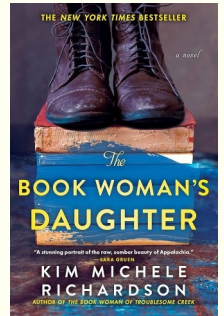
Watching episodes of the "Big Bang" and "Seinfeld," just lets me relax and enjoy some good laughs... even if I have seen every episode over a dozen times.

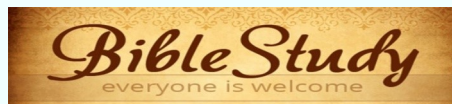


Our last day of Sunday School is May 5th.
