Does the way we choose to steward these gifts God has given us, support the ministry of Christ' church, of this church in the community and the world?

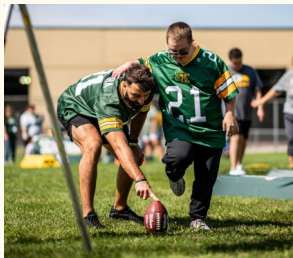
*"You have heard it said," "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."* Where is your treasure and how are you using (stewarding) it? I look forward to exploring this topic together!

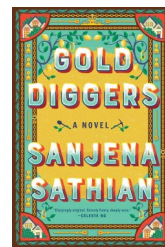
## CHURCH PICNIC - SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 10TH

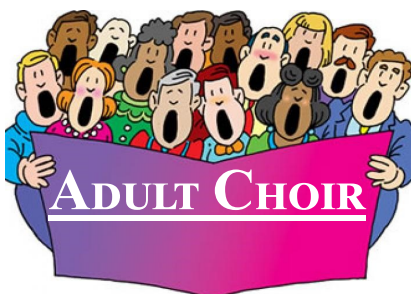

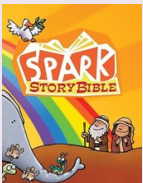

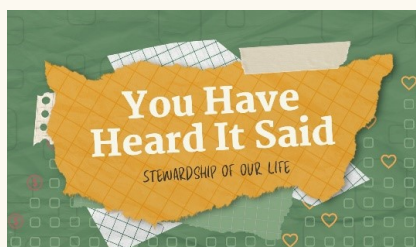

2. **Call to Order:** Travis called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm.

3. **Scripture study, discussion, and prayer:** Scripture selection from Matthew 15:10-20 read by Travis. Following discussion, Ryan led the prayer of the day.

4. **Approval of Agenda:** Travis asked for a motion to approve tonight's Agenda or for any changes. Mike asked that the 2024 budget be added to old business. The motion was made by Dick; second by Bill. Motion carried.

5. **Approval of Consent Agenda:** Travis asked for a motion to approve tonight's Consent Agenda or for any changes. The motion was made by Ryan; second by Katie. Motion carried.

### New Business

6. **Clavinova replacement.** The Clavinova that we have now is 23 years old. The screen, which is essential for use, is not working correctly. Stephanie researched replacement clavinovas with Heid Music. The cost of the recommended replacement is \$11,675. The Trust Fund will be contributing \$5000. Bill made a motion to purchase the clavinova recommended by Worship and Music with funds from capital improvements; second by Dick. Motion carried. Worship and Music will discuss possible uses for the old clavinova.

7. **Electronic Account Security Procedures.** Travis reviewed the current procedures for access to church login and password information and Pastor Cindy confirmed who has access to that information. It was agreed that the procedures were secure and no changes were needed.
