Furnace Update & Call for Support

Dear Church Family,

Over the past three years, our council has been actively exploring options to improve the efficiency of our church's furnace, which was installed in the church's original construction. Throughout this time, we have encountered various challenges, including occasional malfunctions, difficulty in sourcing parts, and increasing inefficiencies that lead to higher monthly energy costs.

We consulted with multiple companies to determine the most cost-effective solution - whether to repair or replace the system. Unfortunately some companies are no longer in business, and system improvements have advanced significantly, offering the potential for substantial savings and better performance. Estimates for replacement have ranged from \$80,000 to over \$250,000.

In July, the council approved moving forward with a new boiler system at a cost of \$95,000, which is scheduled to be installed starting in September. Thanks to your faithful giving over the years, we have secured the necessary funding within our capital improvements budget to cover this project.

We are excited to share that the Trust Fund is currently running a matching grant initiative to assist in restoring some of the monies we are using for this project. We have set a fundraising goal of \$30,000, and the Trust Fund has kindly offered to match up to \$15,000 - meaning your contribution can be effectively doubled.

We invite you to prayerfully consider making a pledge or donation toward this improvement project. Your support will help us reduce ongoing energy costs and ensure a warm, comfortable environment for our church family for years to come.


