When, when will we gather again?

It's a question on many of our minds and hearts and one for which I don't have a definitive answer at this time.

Here is what I do know.

Your Church Council, using guidance from the CDC, state health officials and the ELCA have decided the church building will remain closed through the month of June. The Council will meet (via Zoom) in June and again look to these authorities for guidance in making an informed decision for July. In the meantime the Council has asked the Worship & Music Team to assemble recommendations for when we are able to return to in-person worship. This team will use information from the ELCA as well as our insurance carrier regarding practices and policies we will need to have in place before we can gather again in-person. The Council will review the recommendations and make the final decision on them. Throughout this we will continue to publish worship resources in the newsletter as well as the weekly worship video on our website and YouTube channel.

We are also hoping, weather permitting, to provide a one-time outdoor service. The congregation will stay in their vehicles and we will use a sound system to amplify the worship service in the parking lot. In order to maintain distance between vehicles the service will be offered at both 9:00am and 10:30 am. There will also be a recorded online option available for those unable to attend. The date for this event is Sunday, June 28th.

For now, "with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace," we wait together, while we remain apart.




New windows and the new exit door are being installed in the Santuary!


When Jesus sends his disciples out as missionaries, he warns them of persecution and hardships they will face. He also promises to reward any who aid his followers and support their ministry.
