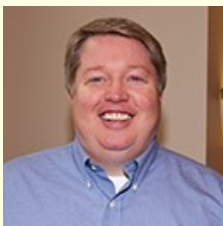

I almost hate to admit that this phenomenon has been happening a lot lately with all the stress being felt in the world due to COVID-19.

Just yesterday, it was Gloria Gaynor's "I Will Survive" that was on repeat in my brain. At the grocery store, when I'm socially distancing myself, it may be Nirvana's "Stay Away" or "Don't Stand So Close to Me" by The Police. World Relief and the *DPCO Food Pantry*.

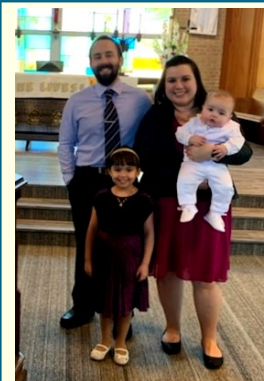
A check was sent to LWR and the supplies pictured were purchased and delivered to the Pantry in April.

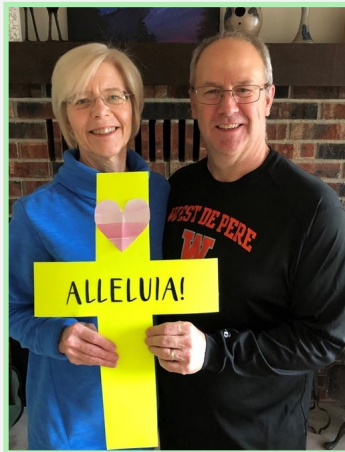

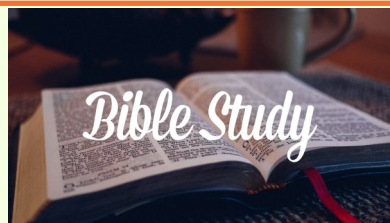

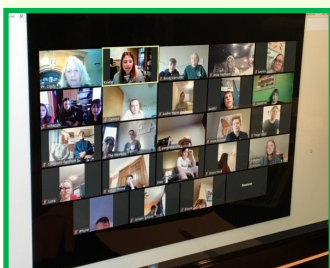

SOUP SUPPERS – AND THE RECIPE CALLS FOR...



Enclosed are the soup recipes that I have received so far...and please feel free to send more! We'll keep sharing these delicious recipes as they come in!

CHICKEN & WILD RICE

INGREDIENTS:

5-2/3 cups water
1 package (4.3 oz) long grain and wild rice mix
1 envelope chicken noodle soup mix
1 celery rib, chopped
1 medium carrot, chopped
½ cup chopped onion
2 cans (10-3/4 ounces each) condensed cream of chicken soup, undiluted
1 cup cubed cooked chicken

DIRECTIONS:

In a large saucepan combine water, rice with contents of seasoning packet and soup mix. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 10 minutes. Stir in the celery, carrot and onion. Cover and simmer for 10 minutes. Stir in chicken soup and chicken. Cook 8 minutes longer or until the rice and vegetables are tender. Yield: 5 servings.

CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE BARS

INGREDIENTS:

1 cup butter
1 1/4 cups brown sugar
3/4 cup white sugar
1 tablespoon vanilla
2 eggs
1 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon salt
2 3/4 cups flour
2 cups chocolate chips, mix of mini and regular
1/4 cup of mini chips to sprinkle on top before baking

DIRECTIONS:

Cream butter and sugars, add eggs and vanilla and mix. Add dry ingredients and thoroughly mix. Pour into prepared pan and sprinkle remaining chips on top. Recipe calls for an 18" by 13" pan. I use a 16" by 11." Prepare with spray and parchment paper. Be generous with chocolate chips!
Bake in 350-degree oven for approximately 20-25 minutes.

CREAMY TORTELLINI & SAUSAGE SOUP

INGREDIENTS:

1.25 pounds ground Italian sausage
1 small white onion, peeled and diced
2 large carrots, peeled and diced
4 garlic cloves, minced
1/4 cup white-whole wheat flour (or all-purpose flour)
6 cups chicken stock
1 (10-ounce) package refrigerated cheese tortellini
5 ounces greens of your choice (I used a mixture of spinach, collards and baby kale)
2 cups milk
salt and pepper

DIRECTIONS:

Cook Italian sausage in a large stockpot over medium-high heat until browned, crumbling it as it cooks. Using a slotted spoon, transfer the cooked sausage to a separate plate and set aside. Reserve two tablespoons of grease in the pan, discarding the rest. *(Or if there's not that much grease remaining, add olive oil to make up the difference.)*

1. Stir in onions and carrots, and sauté for 4-5 minutes or until the onions are soft and translucent, stirring occasionally.
2. Add in the garlic and sauté for an additional 1-2 minutes, or until fragrant, stirring occasionally. Stir in the flour until it's evenly coating the veggies, and cook for an additional 1 minute, stirring occasionally.
3. Gradually add in the chicken stock, and stir to combine. Continue cooking until the mixture reaches a simmer. Then reduce heat to medium-low and simmer for 5 minutes.
4. Stir in the cooked sausage, tortellini, spinach, and milk, and continue simmering for 4-5 minutes, or until the tortellini is Al dente.
5. Taste, and season with salt and pepper to taste. *(I added in about 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon black pepper.)*
Serve immediately or refrigerate in a sealed container for up to 3 days.

More Recipes

CHICKEN BARLEY SOUP

INGREDIENTS:

8 cups chicken or bone broth
1 c. sliced celery
1 c. sliced carrots
1 c. chopped onions
2 c. sliced mushrooms
2 c. cooked pearl barley
2 c. shredded cooked chicken
Parmesan cheese

DIRECTIONS:

In soup pot, combine broth, carrots, celery and onions; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer 15-20 minutes. Add mushrooms; cover and simmer 10-15 minutes. Stir in barley and chicken; heat through. Top each serving with 1 oz. Parmesan cheese. Makes 8 servings.

CREAMY POTATO SOUP (WITH SAUSAGE OPTIONAL)

INGREDIENTS:

1 lb. browned ground sausage or I use Polish Kielbasa and cut length-wise and then in chunks
1 medium onion diced or 1 cup frozen diced onion
2-3 celery stalks
2-3 whole carrots, diced or 1-1/2 cup frozen sliced carrots
3 cups water
6-8 cups diced potatoes (or 5 cups frozen diced hash browns)
2 Tbsp. Vegetable soup base
2 tsp. Wildtree Rancher Steak Rub (or a combination of sea salt, black pepper, garlic, allspice, cinnamon, cloves ginger)
8 oz. sour cream
¼ cup Wildtree Kids Cheez powder cheese (like from a mac and cheese box)
2-1/4 cups milk (divided)
2/3 cup flour
1/3 cup butter

DIRECTIONS:

Place all ingredients up to the sour cream in a crockpot. Stir, cover and cook on low for 4-6 hours or until vegetables are fork tender. To make a roux: In deep saucepan, melt 1/3 cup of butter. Add 2/3 cup of flour and stir to combine and form a paste. Add 2 cups of milk **slowly**, stirring well to thicken. Pour sauce into crockpot and stir to combine. In a shaker bottle (or small bowl) add ¼ cup milk and ¼ cup powder cheese, shake/whisk until combined. Pour cheese mixture into crockpot and stir. Add 8 oz. sour cream and salt and pepper to taste, stir. Let simmer 1 hour and serve. Add additional milk if too thick.

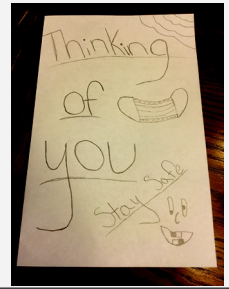
