



#### Luke 13:1-9

Asked about current tragic events, Jesus turns a lesson about whether suffering is deserved into a hard call to obedience. He then tells a parable that holds out hope that the timeline for ultimate judgment will be tempered by patience.

Through the generosity and support of the volunteers and community, the Pantry 506 Butler St. • De Pere • 920.339.1060 was able provide vital


assistance to over 122 households (213 adults and 87 children) in February. Extended hours!!! DPCO is now open on Tuesday's until 6:30!


