Updates

Thank you to the congregation for your generous response to the request for bikes for Afghan refugees. In addition to bikes, we were able to supply helmets and locks for other families and individuals.



While this ministry has us primarily walking with one family, our connection to Catholic Charities has resulted in opportunities to support other refugees with transportation to appointments, events, moving, and the storage and transporting of donations.

The family we partner with is adjusting to life here, (although they are anxious for warmer weather). The father is working full time, six of the children are finishing their first school year here, (the two youngest are at home with mom.) The two older boys have also begun working part time. While language is a challenge, (the family primarily speaks Pashto) the older children speak some English, we use translators on our phones and sometimes pointing, pictures and gestures get the message across. All of

us partnering with the family can attest to the wonderfully rewarding experience it has been to build relationships with this grateful and gracious people. It has also been a privilege to have them share a glimpse of their culture and life in Afghanistan with us.

Innovations

In the 2022 budget the congregation approved funding for a new line item called Ministry Innovations. The intent for this is to have funding available when

a new area of ministry is identified and could use assistance to get up and running. (While funding from this account has not been requested for our new ministry with refugees, this is an example of how the funds could be used.)

We know there are many opportunities for new ministries and we encourage you, the people of St. John to consider how God's Spirit may be leading you to a Ministry Innovation.

How does your faith inform your stewardship? Or how does what you believe in God motivate you in using your time and talent? Knowing each of us has a special gift – then taking that gift and sharing with others lets me see just an inkling of the love Jesus has for us.

What is keeping you "centered" or "sane" right now? Conversing with friends and just allowing everyone to be themselves — joke around, laugh, share stories — realizing that we are all getting through this together and have a solid support system in place.

Anything else you might want to share about yourself? There have been 5 generations of my family baptized and/or members of St John.



How long have you been a member of St. John? We have been members since 2009, when we moved here from the Milwaukee area. We felt very welcomed at St. John.

What is a favorite book, movie or meal and why is it your favorite? Right now my favorite books are the Armand Gamache mysteries by Louise Penny. I like the character development as the series progresses.

What's a memory from your childhood/youth of Sunday School, summer camp, Bible School or even a mission trip that you can share? I grew up Catholic and went to Catholic

school. There was a convent adjacent to the playground, and several of the nuns were our teachers. They were so kind. I remember going to the playground in the summer a lot, and the nuns would invite us in for lemonade when it was hot and let us play their piano. I also remember being mad that I couldn't be an altar boy!

How does your faith inform your stewardship? I think stewardship is an all-day every-day kind of thing. Even little things like folding laundry can be an act of service for others.


What is keeping you centered or "sane" right now? Diet Coke!

EXCITING NEWS FROM PROPERTY AND GROUNDS!



We've been working with Greenleaf Landscaping on ideas for some much needed improvements to the church grounds. At the May meeting the Council approved moving forward with the updates along the building and the Campfire Worship Area.

The sidewalk has now been leveled along the **parking lot side** of the building, and we will be updating the landscaping there with 4 Boxwoods and some Euonymous Gold Splash bushes.




CAMPFIRE WORSHIP AREA

This is the design we are excited to have chosen for this space. The area includes a 24ft round paver circle with a sitting wall around half of the circle. There will be stepping stones from the parking lot to the paver area, mulch and plantings as indicated, creating a woodsy feel to the space. The total cost for the project is \$33,755.

The Trust Fund holds a designated gift of \$3000 for this project. We are hopeful for additional designated gifts for this project and will use monies from the Capitol Improvement fund to cover any amounts that remain.

WISH LIST COURTYARD LANDSCAPING

This is the area behind the offices, between the GREAT room and the original building. The design provides 2- 10ft paver block areas for seating. Shade trees, assorted shrubs and mulch. The area could be used for small group gatherings, bible studies, youth group and Sunday School class activities. The cost of this plan (if approved this year and funding is secured) would be \$20,000.






LORD'S PRAYER




