SAYING GOODBYE TO THE MORTGAGE



Despite the pandemic, it's an exciting time to be a member of St. John. We're finding ways to navigate through these tough times, and we're accomplishing big things while we do it. One of those things is paying off the mortgage by the end of this year. Yes, you read that right. We're going to pay off the mortgage by Dec. 31 ... more than five years ahead of time.

Just paying off the mortgage is something to celebrate, but the fact that we're doing it on an accelerated timeline, during a pandemic and saving ourselves \$53,000 in interest payments is pretty amazing.

While we should all be excited about that, I'm extra excited about it. That's because it fulfills a promise that the council made to the congregation. I remember it very well, even though it was quite a few years ago, because I was part of the council making that promise. Unlike today, we were having some financial struggles, and we asked the congregation to refinance so we could get a better rate and, more importantly at the time, lower our payments.

It was a tough call and not everyone agreed. It meant we'd be extending the length of the mortgage, but we promised the congregation that we'd try our best to make extra payments so we could pay off that new mortgage early.

We knew it wouldn't be easy, however, for a number of reasons. First and foremost, the reason we needed to refinance was because of our financial situation, which didn't really bode well for making extra payments. Well, St. John, you came through

to help me and the rest of that council keep our promise, and in a big way. If you had told me back then that our financial health would be where it is today, it would have been very difficult for me to believe. Today, I'm a believer ... but I should have believed back then.

As Christians, we're called to believe. Just like with the mortgage, however, there are lots of things that come at us that sometimes test that belief. Even Jesus' disciples doubted sometimes. In the end, however, Jesus shows us the way. He models the behavior for us. He teaches us how to love one another and demonstrates His love for us in so many ways.

At St. John, our actions show that we believe. We worship together, we laugh together, we cry together ... and we make a difference together. Not only is our financial health strong, but everything about St. John makes me proud. We're a great family that truly cares about each other. We're giving back to our community through volunteer efforts. We've also increased our monetary gifts to impact people not only in Northeast Wisconsin but the world. We're finding new ways to spread our ministry.


Thank you, St. John, for showing the way as we live our faith and enrich lives in our congregation, our community and the world every day.




