

I am pleased to share with you plans to return to in person indoor worship. The date to resume is based on a fully vaccinated rate for Brown County of at least 50% and an infection rate of less than 10% per 100,000 residents. At the current rate that vaccines are being administered we expect to add the indoor option for worship on or about <u>Sun. June 6th</u>.

We will offer an 8:00am indoor service per the guidelines you can find on page 6 as well as a 9:00am service in the parking lot. The 8:00am service will also be live streamed on our YouTube channel.

<u>Criteria:</u> Using data from Wisconsin Dept. of Health Services, and guidelines from Wisconsin Council of Churches and the CDC.

Worship Services: Maximum 50 per service

Times: Sunday, 8am indoor, (this service also live streamed on our YouTube channel) Sunday, 9:00am worship in the parking lot.

The following is an effort to keep everyone as safe as possible while indoors.

- ✤ To accommodate the 50 person limit, you are asked to sign up prior to the service by using Signup genius or calling the church office to confirm available space.
- ✤ Please observe 6 feet of physical distancing as you enter/exit the sanctuary and in the pews.
- ✤ All attendees must wear masks. Please bring your own, or one will be provided.
- ✤ Single use bulletins. Please place bulletins in recycling bins after worship.
- ✤ All hymnals, papers in pews, children's bags have been removed.
- Offering may be placed in the wooden church box located in the narthex.
- ✤ There will be limited congregational singing and speaking.
- ✤ No physical sharing of the peace.
- ✤ Holy Communion will be available for you to pick up as you enter the sanctuary and partake during the service. (This would be the only time you are permitted to lower your mask.)
- ✤ No Acolyte or Greeters. Ushers have revised duties (see below)
- Singers/wind musicians will be masked and a minimum of 16 feet from others. Services will be 30 minutes or less.

To keep all worshippers safe, please do not congregate in the narthex prior to the service and promptly exit the building at the end of service. Don't attend if you have any symptoms of illness or have been exposed to someone who is ill.

Usher duties

Prop open doors as weather allows

Count people in attendance.

Dismiss worshippers at the end of the service beginning from the back pew.

After service:

Secure offering in safe in sacristy following service Wipe down entry/exit and bathroom door handles, and offering box with disinfectant wipes.


