

God's Work. Our Hands, Through Advocacy

Wisconsin is an epicenter for the coronavirus pandemic. Our Covid-19 numbers are exploding. Non-partisan science and health leaders are very clear about what we can all do individually to reduce the risk of this virus for ourselves and our neighbors. The Faith Community leaders of Wisconsin have made the following pledge.

As people of faith, we trust in a higher power to help us through crises. But we must also trust science and what the medical experts are telling us. The best way to slow the spread of COVID-19 is to keep contacts outside our household to an absolute minimum. Wearing masks, washing hands, and staying physically distanced are all important and vital measures we all must take. But reducing our contacts with anyone beyond the people we live with is the best way to keep us all safe.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services has issued an order to keep public gatherings to under 25% of capacity. Houses of worship have been exempted from this requirement. However, as faith leaders, we pledge to steward the health of all by prioritizing remote worship and other activities until this crisis has passed.

It is crucial that we stay home as much as possible to protect ourselves, our families, our communities, and especially first responders and health care workers who risk their lives to care for us. As the Rev. Kerri Parker, Executive Director of the Wisconsin Council of Churches, has said, "Being a faithful people is not abstract; it is about applying our faith when it matters. This virus is not going to get itself under control. We have a responsibility to each other. We are able to worship, pray, provide faith formation and pastoral care, and address other community needs in ways that limit the risk of spreading COVID, to save lives and relieve the strain on the health system. We have a moral imperative to do so."

Embracing that moral imperative, we pledge to stay safe, for all our sakes!

The ELCA Bishops have contacted our state elected legislature, requesting they take leadership in creating mandates that follow DHS guidelines to protect the entire state of Wisconsin and save lives. The Lutheran Office of Public Policy (LOPPW) asks us to "lift our voices during the pandemic"; to pray and to take action. Not only by contacting our federal and state legislators, but by contacting our local leaders to ask for the creation of our own safety net of guidelines to protect us and our neighbors.
