REFUGEE RELIEF IN GREEN BAY

In the Green Bay area, we are working with Catholic Charities of Green Bay in Refugee Relief. There are opportunities of all kinds that you can become involved in. I encourage you to join me on Sunday, Jan. 30th at 9:00am for more information.

One of the goals for this initial meeting will be to begin to put together Good Neighbor Teams. Teams consist of 6-8 people that make a minimum 6 month commitment to welcoming and walking alongside a particular family. One of the main goals of these teams is to build relationships as we learn from each other.

Catholic Charities requires all volunteers working with refugees to complete the following before placement with a family.

- 1. Application and background check
- 2. Safe environment training (this can be done online.)
- 3. Volunteer Orientation

We have scheduled an initial **Volunteer Orientation for Thursday February 3rd at 6:30pm at St. John.** Catholic Charities preference is that you attend in person, however we will also offer a zoom link option. (Watch next week's Monday e-blast for the link)

If you are unable to attend this initial informational meeting Sunday, Jan. 31st, but are interested in helping with this ministry in any way, please let me know. I will get you the information for the initial steps of volunteering. pastorcindy@stjohndepere.org

Refugee Relief in Green Bay

Refugee Most Immediate Needs:

- 1) People to assist with refugees (Good Neighbor Teams)
 - Volunteers that can run people to appointments, form supportive community around their newest neighbors or share skills such as ESL teaching basic auto repair, resume and job hunting and baby/child sitting.
- 2) Any contacts who work in property management and would be willing/able to rent to the refugees, most of whom have no credit history or, in some cases even an SSN. There is an urgent need for larger family (6-10+) housing.
- 3) Any employers with openings for folks with minimal English, though perhaps skills
- 4) Any leads on inexpensive reliable cars
- 5) 1-2 **Researchers** who could assist CC looking for apartments and other info (can be done online)
