

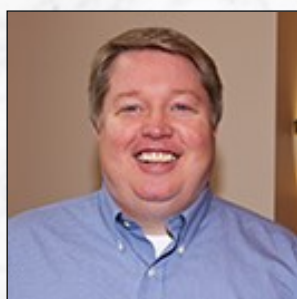

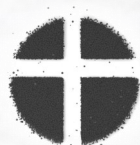

This is an artist rendering of the stained glass that will be placed in the windows behind the altar. There will be about a 16" wide cross at the center created from slightly diffused glass which will connect us to the world through the cross while we worship. The ribbons out from the cross are meant to create movement that begins at the cross and carries out into the worship space and the world. Work has begun on these pieces. The panels are being created in the studio at the Glass Haus. We had hoped the project would be completed by mid April, but the glass manufacturer is behind in production due to the pandemic.

We will keep you posted with photos and updates on anticipated finish dates as we are able.

WAYS Send a kid to camp!

It has been a long standing practice at St. John for students to attend confirmation camp together as part of their faith formation. Last summer, as the pandemic closed the camp, we were not able to hold our usual week at camp. This led the Faith Formation Team to re-think how we approach camp attendance and brainstorm ways to better utilize the amazing faith building experience of attending camp. How might we encourage more students and families to experience camp and have it become a part of their summer must do list? We know that students who experience camp at an earlier age are more likely to attend camp on a regular basis. So rather than waiting for them to enter 7th grade before we encourage them to give it a try we want to make camp available to more ages. We are excited, with the help of the Trust Fund, to offer scholarships of \$200 for a full week and \$100 for a half week of camp at Crossways. The Trust Fund has committed up to \$2000 in scholarships and has also agreed to manage any funds given and designated to “Send a Kid to Camp”. A “Kid” can be any age, youth through adult as Crossways offers family and grand parent camp. Please visit www.crosswayscamps.org to check out what is available this summer. INVITATION TO LENT

Today with the whole Church we enter the time of remembering Jesus' Passover from death to life, and our life in Christ is renewed. We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. But our sinful rebellion separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our creator intended. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent – self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love – strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. Let us continue our journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection.

My waste and pollution of your creation, and lack of concern for those who come after me, I confess to you.

Have mercy on me, O God.

Restore me, O God, and let your anger depart from me. Hear me, O God, for your mercy is great.

Imposition of Ashes

This day and this time of reflection remind us again that life is a gift and that our very breath is from God alone. Without that breath, we are nothing but lifeless dust. In this ritual we remember that this one beautiful life is for loving and serving God and one another. Knowing that dust and ash surround us in the air, you are invited to mark your forehead or hand with the sign of the cross as you remember these words:

“Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”

Prayer: Accomplish in me, O God, the work of your salvation, that I may show forth your glory in the world. By the cross and passion of your Son, our Savior, bring me with all your saints to the joy of his resurrection.

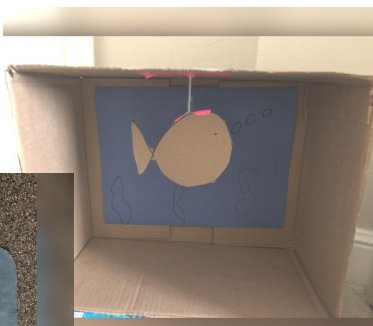
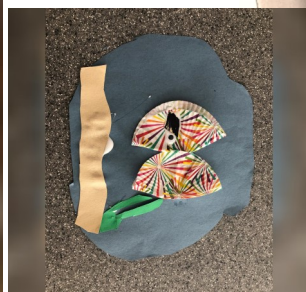
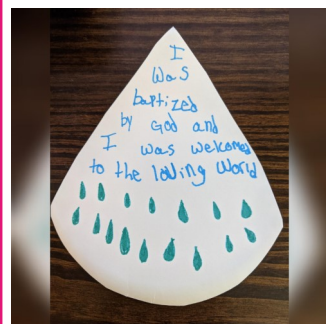

DPCO INFORMATION

It is with great joy and deepest admiration that I am thrilled to be able to share DPCO's year end final contributions with you. Despite the challenges of the COVID-19 virus, DPCO Thrift Store was able to provide over \$223,562 to strengthen 47 local non-profit organizations. In addition to supporting and sustaining the local non-profits, we were also able to provide much needed assistance to help local De Pere residents with the rent and utilities, as well as emergency gas needs. We were able to accomplish this given the fact that DPCO was closed for 3+ months, operating with limited hours and customers for over half the year. What an impact! All glory, honor and praise be given to our Heavenly Father for giving us the opportunity to do good deeds through HIM. We simply can't thank everyone enough for your donations, financial support, patronage, and the volunteers who make this ALL POSSIBLE. Thank you for helping DPCO "Care for the Community through Christ's love and His Compassion!"

During the month of December, the Pantry gave over 70 hams to all the families during Christmas and helped over 186 households (352 adults and 156 children). Evening hours continue to be postponed. Thank you for helping DPCO "Care for the Community through Christ's love and His Compassion!"
