





## **IN RESPONSE TO UPDATED CDC GUIDELINES**

We ask that you respect other's personal space and choices. Please call the church office or use signup genius to attend the indoor service.

Remember that we'll also continue to provide alternative worship experiences for those not comfortable being inside yet. We will continue the parking lot service at 9 a.m. – weather permitting – and the 8 a.m. service will be streamed and available afterward on our YouTube channel.

The Council will monitor attendance trends at the services as well as vaccination rates and information from health officials and will modify our guidelines and worship services as is appropriate.
