## ~ Meet the Council ~



The Stewardship Team thought it would be helpful for the congregation to get to know the members of Council on a more personal level. Each month we will feature one Council person and their responses to a variety of questions.

This month we are featuring **Jim Johaneck**, who began serving on the Council in January of 2020.

### **How long have you been a member of St. John? What brought you to St. John?**

Linda and I have been members of St. John for almost seven years. We moved here from Manitowoc in 2014 because of her job. Prior to relocating, we went to separate churches (Methodist and Missouri Synod Lutheran) and thought this would be the ideal time to find a church for both of us. We found St. John to be a welcoming congregation that gave us a religious home and a sense of belonging.

### **What is a favorite book, movie or meal and why is it your favorite?**

I'm not a big reader or movie go-er, but I do enjoy a good meal. In my case that's BBQ. A good BBQ place is hard to find, (this isn't Oklahoma or Texas) but Parker John's in Ashwaubenon works well for me. Every so often, I gotta have my burnt ends.

### **What is a talent no one knows you have?**

Whatever that talent might be, it must really be obscure because even I don't know what it is.

### **What's a memory from your childhood/youth of Sunday School, summer camp, Bible School or even a mission trip that you can share?**

This past Sunday, January 30, one of the readings was from I Corinthians 13. For my Confirmation, I had to memorize and recite that whole chapter about faith, hope and love. The nuns were real task-masters; sermon notes would have been a breeze.

### **How does your faith inform your stewardship? Or how does what you believe in God motivate you in using your time and talent?**

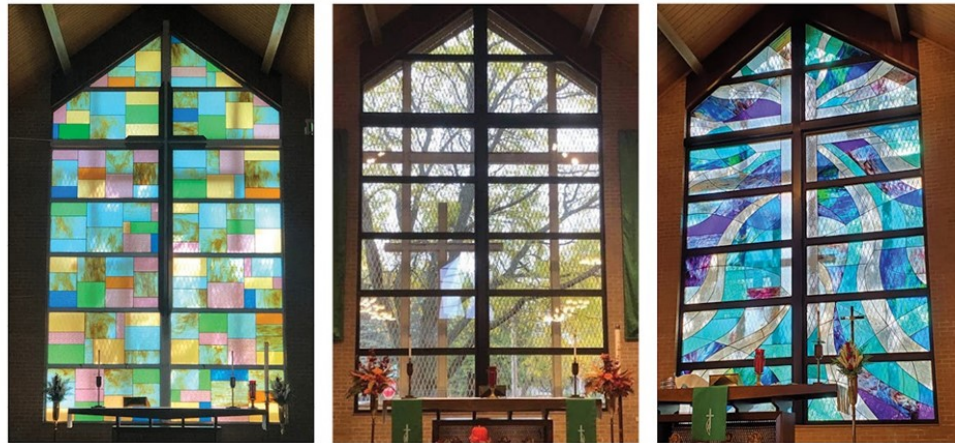
I believe it's important for members to become involved in the workings of their church. First of all, it's a great way to meet fellow members. Second, it sets an example for others (family, friends, neighbors, etc.). If you're involved, the more likely they are to become involved. And third, by being an involved member, one has that sense of belonging, of camaraderie, of being a part of something "bigger". I think that idea is important for everyone. It gives purpose to your life and all people need that.

### **What is keeping you "centered" or "sane" right now?**

Honestly, it's my involvement with the Church Council. As Council Secretary, there's a fair amount of paper work to do, and I enjoy doing it. I keep looking at "process" and how we do things, why we do things, things we don't do, things we maybe should do. I consider myself to be a change agent so I keep looking for alternatives.

**Anything else you might want to share about yourself? Family, where you are from, anything else?** I enjoy teaching. I taught Confirmation, Sunday School and a Bible Class at my previous church. I also taught Field Artillery in the Army; all useful topics, but hardly interchangeable.

## ST. JOHN STAINED GLASS DESIGN



Tasked with the amazing opportunity to design the stained glass for the sanctuary windows, we integrated two objectives:

1. To connect with the outside world
2. To evoke emotion

The cross in the center was originally created to accentuate the thin, wooden cross that was previously hanging. The clear, textured glass was designated for this icon to let in the most light while also being a beacon for our connection to the outside community. The ends of the cross are intentionally angled – reaching out, spreading Jesus' story.

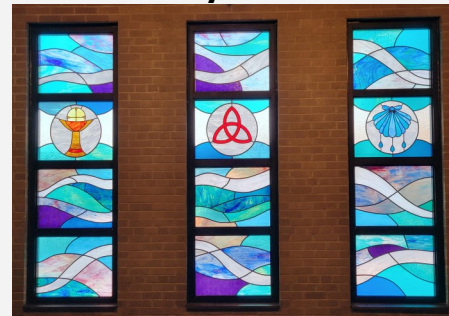
The marbled white ribbons streaming from the cross represent God's love radiating from the cross, flowing through the rest of the sanctuary in the side windows. It is emotive; encouraging us to continue sharing that love out in the world.

The use of blues and greens represent our connection to the world around us; the earth and all God's creations. Several of the colors were chosen to match the original stained glass from the first St. John Church location on Grant Street. Those restored pieces, dating back to the late 1800's, are currently hanging on the windows between the narthex and sanctuary.

It was a true blessing to be part of this amazing project that will hopefully move and inspire those who come to worship here.
